This month's artist is our very own Mikayla Wobrak!!! She is very talented, and we are lucky to have her display!

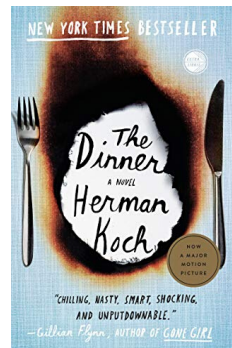
